Adult Education's Effect on Communities

Impact

- Adult education provides numeracy, literacy, English language skills, digital literacy, work readiness, soft skills, high school equivalency, and numerous wrap-around services to millions of adult learners nationwide
- Recent Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data shows that job growth is about zero or negative for those with no college education. Low-income students are 2.4 times more likely to drop out of school as middle-income students and 10 times more likely to drop out than students from higher income families.

- Today, <u>43 million adults</u> are low-skilled in literacy and <u>62.7 million</u> adults are low-skilled in numeracy.
- Adult education can be the solution to the skills gap between employers and workers, if funding meets demand.
- Adult education programs provide an economic boost to participants, employers and
 communities. In terms of participants, according to a recent Economic Mobility
 Corporation study, "unemployed residents with prior US work experience who enrolled in
 an employment-focused English course boosted their earnings by an average of more
 than \$7,100 annually two years after starting the program, compared with unemployed
 non-English speakers who weren't in the program."
- As for employers, they see benefits in finding workers who can bridge the skills gap
 mismatch that persists in many fields. Employers also partner with adult education
 programs to develop courses that provide learners the skills and knowledge that local
 employers need.
- According to COABE estimates, for every dollar invested in adult education, the surrounding community receives \$60 back in increased income and property taxes and savings on legal system and welfare expenses.

Legislative Priorities for Adult Education

Funding Request

- Demand for adult education programs is high because of the economic boost programs provide to participants, employers, and communities.
- Adult education programs enable learners to gain the skills necessary to succeed in the
 workforce, allowing them to earn wages that support their families. At the same time,
 adult education programs provide employers with a pool of skilled workers to fill
 in-demand jobs. Our request is for \$810 million for the Adult Education State Grants
 program in FY 2025. With an increase in funding, local programs will be able to build
 capacity to serve more learners, hire more full-time teachers and increase retention,
 thereby boosting the ability of adult education to continue to serve as a critical
 component of our nation's workforce development system, supporting employers and
 individuals in our State

Policy Requests

Adult Education WORKS Act

- We appreciate that Congress has started the process to reauthorize the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) as it provides a significant opportunity to improve adult education (authorized under Title II of WIOA).
- In April, the House of Representatives passed a bipartisan WIOA reauthorization bill, <u>H.R. 6655</u>, <u>A Stronger Workforce for America Act</u>, on a vote of 378-26. This bill includes several provisions stemming from the bipartisan Adult Education WORKS Act (<u>S. 3075/H.R. 5987</u>) that COABE worked to secure, such as:
 - Promoting the use of integrated education and training programs (IETs);
 - Providing opportunities to professionalize the adult educator field;
 - Recognizing that adult learners need to gain digital literacy skills;
 - Ensuring additional resources are devoted to professional development for practitioners; and
 - Requiring the Department of Education to disseminate effective practices used by States to use administrative data to determine program performance
- We were excited to also see some of our priorities reflected in the WIOA discussion draft released by the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee in June.
- Both bills, however, fall short by not including key provisions from the bipartisan Adult Education WORKS Act that COABE believes are critical to updating and strengthening adult education.
- In a final WIOA reauthorization bill, we urge Congress to incorporate the rest of COABE's priorities, including:
 - Improving collaboration and coordination between Title I and II programs by adding adult education representation on the state workforce development board;
 - Ensuring workers learn the digital literacy and information literacy skills that are in-demand by employers;
 - Promoting integrated education and training programs so learners gain skills and training concurrently with education services;
 - Allowing innovation within the performance accountability system to better measure student and program success; and
 - Ensuring college and career preparation activities are provided by skilled professionals such as college and career navigators.

Strengthening Research in Adult Education Act

- To understand how to best educate and upskill our nation's <u>43 million adults</u> who
 are low-skilled in literacy, it is critical that the work of practitioners, stakeholder
 and policymakers be informed by relevant, actionable and recent research in
 adult literacy.
- That is why COABE is advocating for legislation to improve research in adult education.
- The bipartisan Strengthening Research in Adult Education Act (<u>S. 1268</u> in 118th Congress) introduced by Senators Jack Reed (D-RI) and Todd Young (R-IN) would direct the National Center on Education Research (NCER) to collect data and carry out research on successful state and local adult education and literacy activities that result in increased literacy and numeracy and educational attainment for adult learners, the characteristics and academic achievements of adult learners and access to, and opportunity for, adult education, all while requiring NCER to draw on the expertise of adult educators when developing policies and priorities related to adult education.

Issue a Proclamation
